- Created in 2021 with the "Always Ready Bill."
- Five program elements:
 - Planning grants.
 - Implementation grants.
 - Regional resilience entities (RRE).
 - Statewide data set and assessment.
 - Florida Flood Hub (FFH).

- Other initiatives:
 - Florida Seafloor Mapping Initiative.
 - Florida Estuarine Restoration Team.
 - Statewide living shorelines suitability model.
 - Quarterly Resilience Forum.











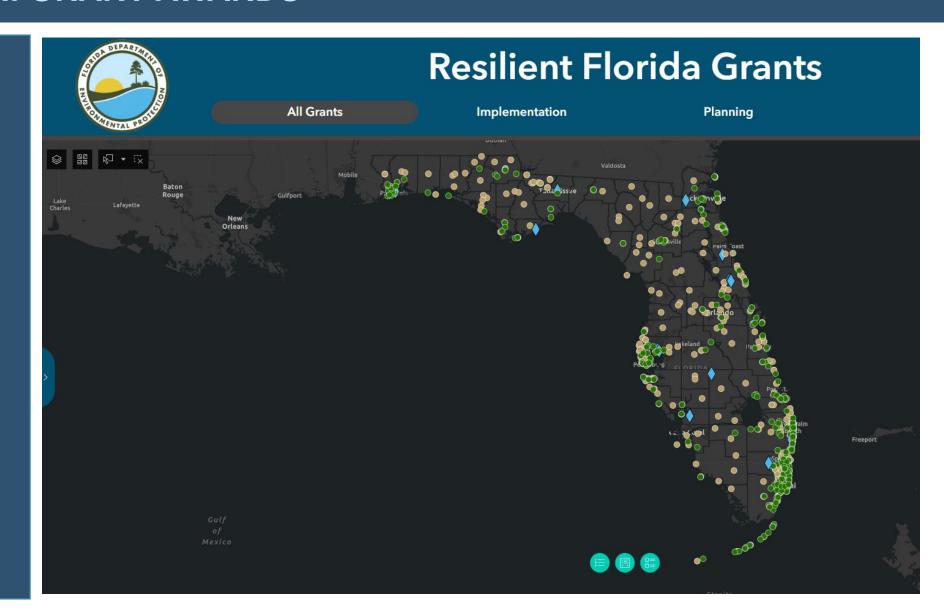

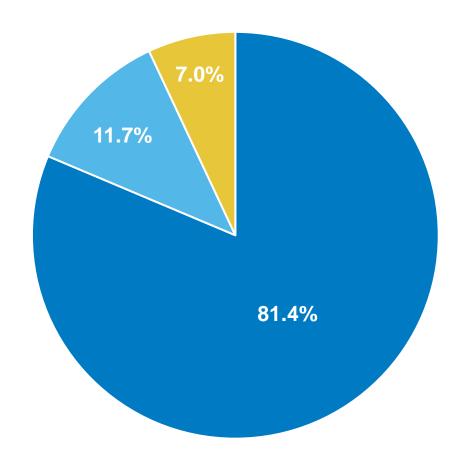
PROGRAM GRANT AWARDS

 - o \$5,000,000.

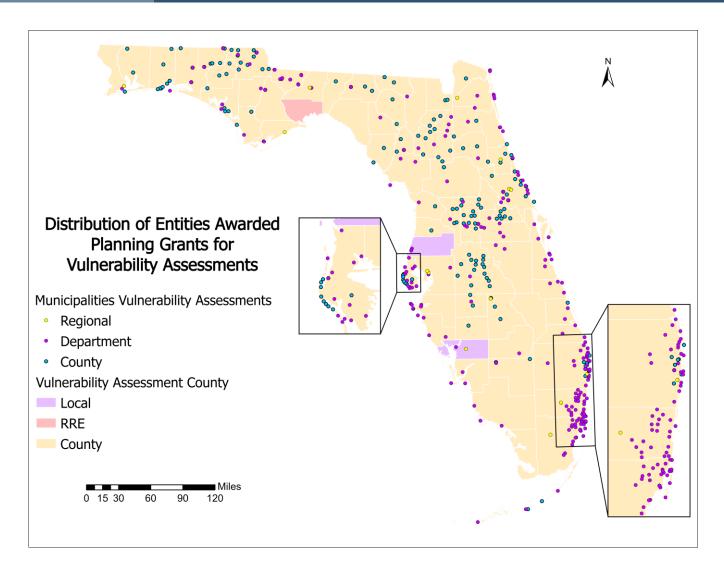


- Vulnerability Assessments

PLANNING GRANTS FOCUS ON VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENTS



- RF supporting Vulnerability
 Assessments (VAs) for 65
 counties and 367 municipalities.
 - RRE funding supporting VAs some counties and municipalities.
- Two counties and one municipality submitting data on their own.

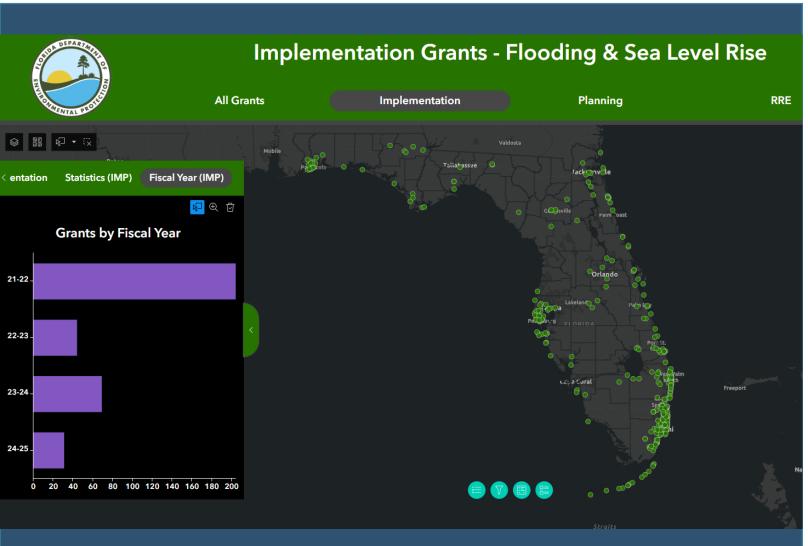


- Application assistance:

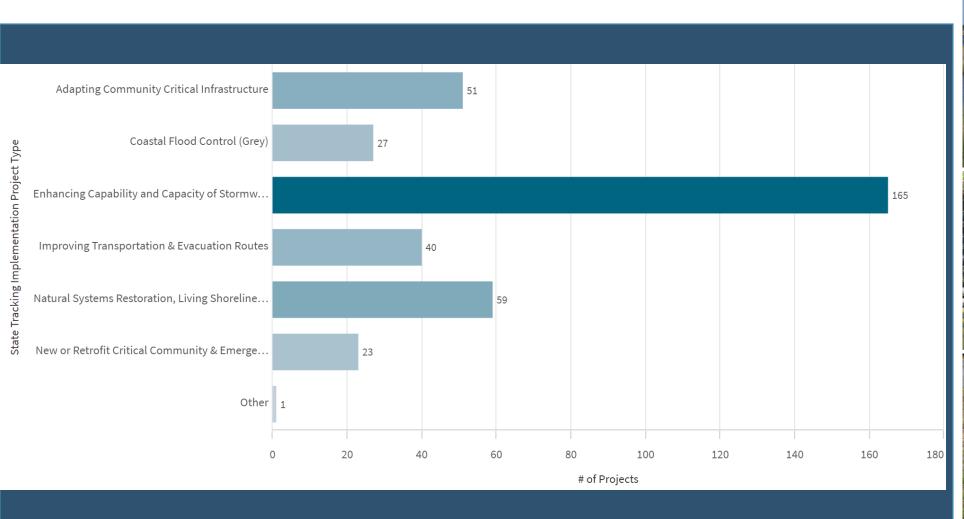
IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS ADAPTATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS



- Statewide Flooding and Sea Level Rise Resilience Plan.
 - Prioritized list of projects that address risks of flooding and sea level rise to critical or regionallysignificant assets within coastal and inland communities.
 - Projects that address risks identified from statewide or local VA.



IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS PROJECT TYPE







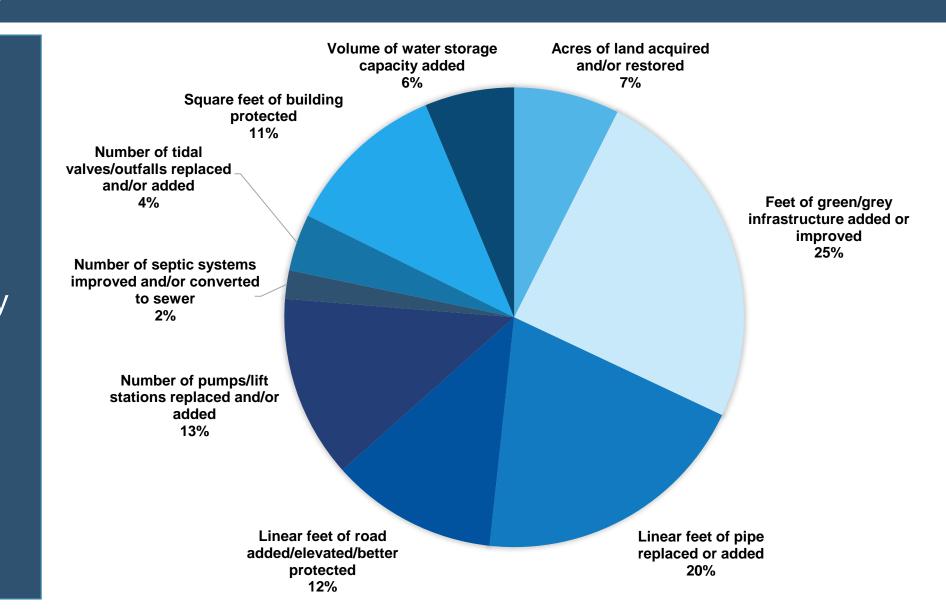

IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS UPCOMING PROJECTS



Pre-construction of City of North Lauderdale Canal Rehabilitation.



67 projects estimated to start construction Oct.-Dec. 2024. Total DEP funding: \$134,773,732

Project Types:

- Stormwater: 36.
- Living Shorelines and Natural Systems Restoration: Eight.
- Coastal Infrastructure: Four.
- Emergency Facilities: One.
- Wastewater: Eight.
- Transportation and Evacuation: Six.
- Drinking Water: Two.
- Natural/Cultural Resources: One.
- Land Acquisition and Conservation: Zero.

City of North Lauderdale Canal Rehabilitation: Restoration of 4 miles of drainage canals; installation of geo-tubes or erosion barriers.

Florida Keys Aqueduct Authority (FKAA) – Marathon Pump Station Adaptation Project: Elevation of pump station and operations building and improvements to facility.

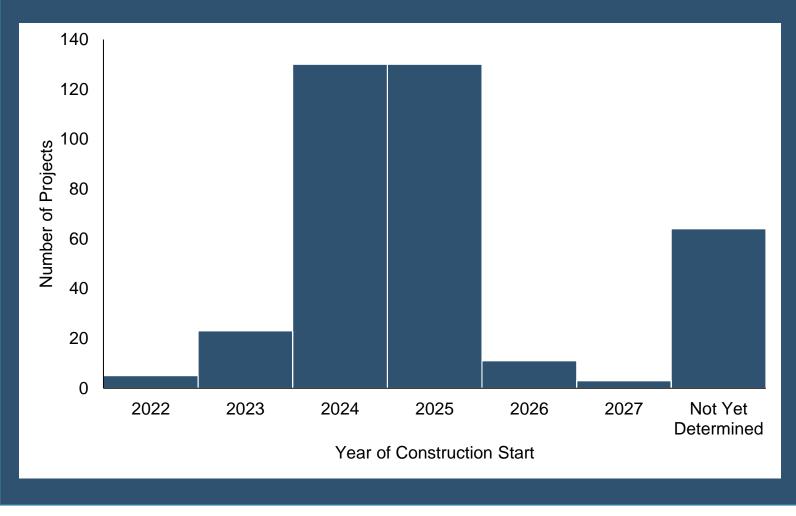

RF LESSONS LEARNED



- Planning effort challenges:
 - Extended timelines for completion.
 - Inconsistent approaches.
 - Cost overruns.
- Adaptation and infrastructure project challenges:
 - Timing of grant and match fund awards.
 - Match fund eligibility.
 - Design and permitting delays.
 - Implementation of complex projects in existing environment.
 - Scope of work adjustments.
 - During design and/or unexpected changes required during construction.
 - Cost of materials and cost overruns.
- Enhanced program resources:
 - Regular site visits from regional field agent staff.



PROGRAM GROWTH

Program staffing growth.

• 2021: 25 positions.

• 2022: 50 positions.

- Funding appropriations and grant awards exceeded expectations and statute.
 - State and federal appropriations.
- Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-25 State Plan
 - 196 eligible applications > \$865 million.
 - Awarded 29 projects.
